### The reason for our months of "virtual" meetings on ZOOM - the COVID-19 coronavirus - was the subject of our program on Wednesday, July 8th

Our speaker on July 8 was Kristen Aird of the Oregon Health Authority, who discussed and showed us some of the many online resources available to us -- one such page is shown above. "We are still in the first wave and are still resurging," she told us -- and, it's only been getting worse since then - particularly in Multnomah County. She explained "contact tracing", and remarked that adequate indoor ventilation requires more fresh air be let in. As concerns returning students to school for studying in a classroom environment, she agreed that "students are better off at school". but she reminded that full protections are still needed at this time, and "online programming is still involved." Face masks are required in public situations, as is "social distancing", as well.
